




Registration through the PIACC is available for \$5.00 per household and \$10.00 for businesses. We will be producing maps with locations of yard sales again this year. Don't be missed by not registering. Drop your registration and payment off Tuesday through Thursday from 9-4 at the Chamber office or mail it to 3 Houlton Rd., Presque Isle, ME 04769.

Presque Isle has a regulation entitled "Chapter 58-City of Presque Isle Garage Sale Sign Ordinance" which sets regulations for the number, size, location and duration that garage/yard sale signs may be posted within the city.

"Two signs of not more than four square feet (2' x 2') each shall be permitted to be displayed on the property of the residence where the sale is being conducted" The new regulation also states that two signs of not more than two square feet each are permitted, providing written permission to erect said signs is received from the property owners upon whose property such signs are to be placed. Each sign shall contain the name of the person conducting the garage/yard sale.

Most importantly, the regulations clearly require the removal of the off-premise garage/yard sale signs within 48 hours of the end of the conducted sale.
